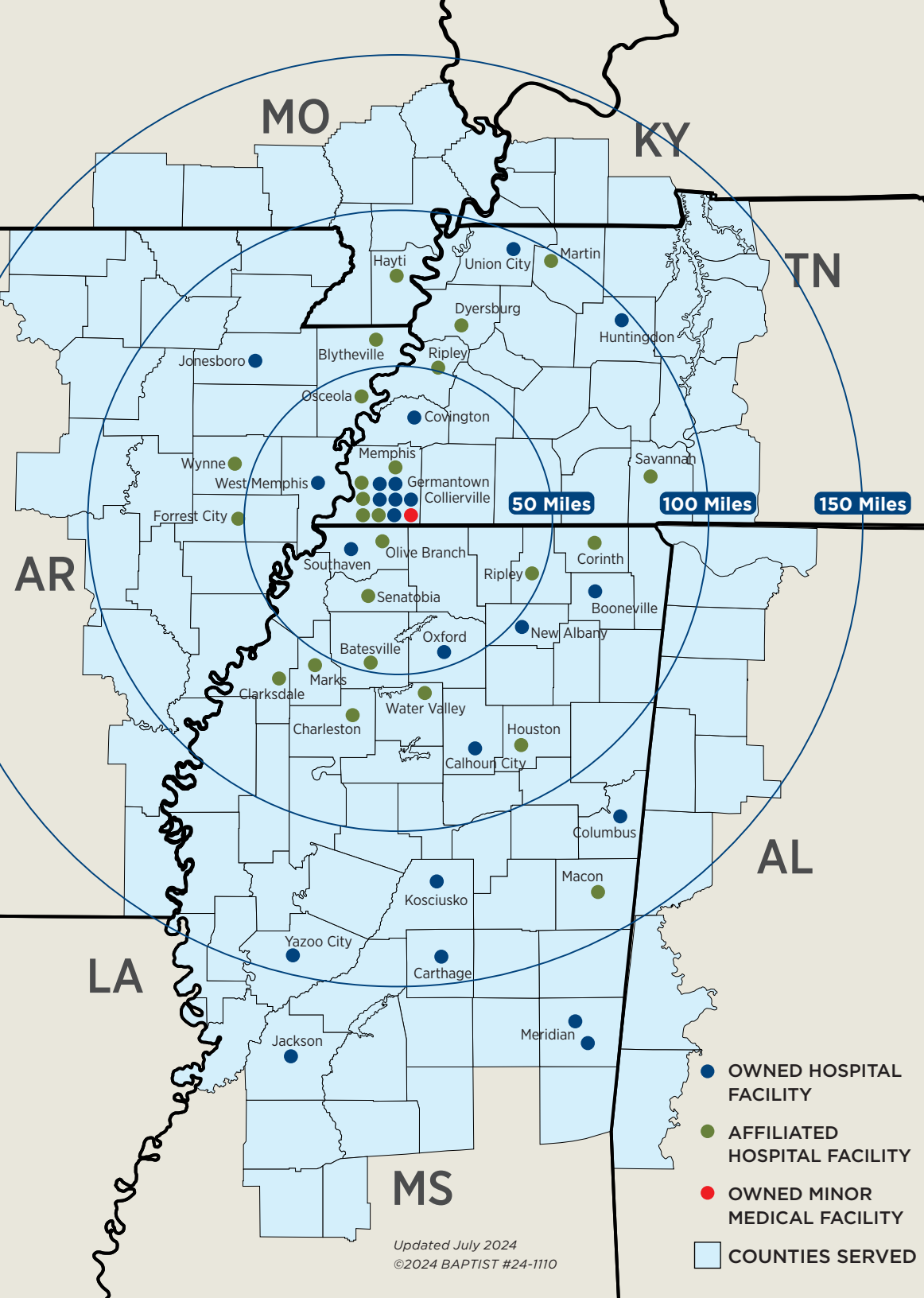

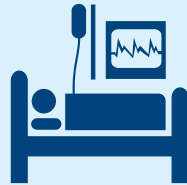
Fiscal Year 2023
